THE ALIEN TREK 8hr ROGAINE – SATURDAY 20th JULY 2013 10am to 6pm

July's rogaine is set in the box-ironbark forests around Redcastle, about 20 kilometres north of Heathcote. Major Mitchell (who else?) was the first European to explore the area. He arrived in 1836, and by 1850 many pastoralists had settled in the district. Gold was discovered at Rushworth in 1853, and the McIvor rush near Heathcote soon followed. Since then the forests of the area have been used for many commercial purposes. Charcoal was produced from the 1850s by covering a fallen tree with soil and letting it burn slowly. The first eucalyptus distillery was built in 1874 and eucalyptus oil is produced to this day from mallee forests near Rushworth. From about 1920 to the 1970s the forests provided electricity and telephone poles that were used throughout Victoria. Over many years the production and transport of firewood, railway sleepers, and bridge and mining timbers were a major source of employment in the district.

The rogaining course and surrounding areas has several types of eucalypts, namely Red Ironbark, Grey Box, Yellow Gum, Red Stringybark, Red Box, Long leaf Box and River Red Gums. The poor quality soils and low rainfall (500-600 millimetres a year) mean that trees grow slowly. For example, Austral Grass-trees, which can live up to 600 years, grow an average of only 1 to 2 centimetres annually. Rogainers reaching the north of the course could see the miniature forest of these beautiful plants. The forest contains a variety of native peas, grevilleas, heaths, grasses and orchids, although flowers are relatively scarce at this time of year. Larger plants found in the area include cherry ballarts, sweet

bursaria, and several wattles and hakeas. The bush is home to some uncommon or endangered mammals and birds, such as the Brush-tailed Phascogale, Squirrel Glider, Swift Parrot, Powerful Owl, Painted Honeyeater and Regent Honeyeater.

The hash house site is known as Alien Camp. During the Second World War prisoner-of-war camps were established at Graytown and other places in the district. The Graytown camp initially housed about 250 Italian POWs and later German POWs. The Germans were mostly crew members from the raider ship Kormoron, which had sunk HMAS Sydney off the Western Australian coast.

The bush around Redcastle is ideal for rogaining. The course is entirely within native forest, part of which is in the Heathcote-Graytown National Park. There are no fences, the terrain is gently undulating and the undergrowth is sparse, allowing easy movement between checkpoints. Rogainers can choose navigationally safer routes by using the extensive track network. However, the subtlety of the terrain will challenge those who take direct routes to stay in touch with the map and not to let 'their feet move faster than their heads'.

Location

The Hash House is about 130 km north of
Melbourne. The nearest town is Heathcote,
which is about 20 km south of the event
area. The event location has a gold mining
past, and the Heathcote area is known for
its vineyards and wineries.

Course

The course is entirely in native box
ironbark forest. Part of the course will be
in the Heathcote Graytown National Park.
The terrain is gently undulating with sparse
undergrowth allowing easy cross country
travel, but careful navigation is often
required.

Map

The map is based on the new VicMap
1:30000 series, with 10 metre contours
and aligned to Grid North.

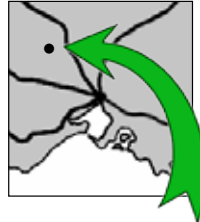

Location

The course area is located 5 to 10 km south east of Bendigo and 145km from Melbourne CBD to the Hash House site. The terrain is very open spur and gully bushland with no fences. It is undulating and not steep.

Course

The course is set across a State Forest and a National Park. The two forest areas are separated by the Emu Creek and farm land along the creek. There are two 1km roads connection between the forests for the teams expecting to bag lots of Checkpoints.

Close in, the Check points are closer together. Further out they will be about a kilometre apart with the potential to be more challenging.

Event Format

These are two Separate Rogaines. Enter either day not both. Both events use the same map. Hash house catering will be provided at the conclusion of each event.

EVENT START TIME IS 10:00 AM, FINISH IS AT 4:00 PM, with Admin opening at 8:00am.

Map

The A3 map at a scale of 1:25000 with 10 metre contours. There is about 150 metres elevation variation across the course with mostly well defined spurs and gullies. The Map has more tracks mapped than our usual Rogaine maps however not all tracks are mapped and some are revegetating well. The accurate tracks are thank you to Bendigo Orienteers who have allow us to use this extra detail. The map will be of the normal Rogaine Maps Standards and appearance other than the extra tracks and dams. The extra track will enable you to decide between the direct cross country option or less often less direct track option.

Accommodation

There are plenty of accommodation options in Bendigo and a hotel at Harcourt. Camping for volunteers at the Hash House site.

Schools Champs

McKinnon makes a clean sweep at Daylesford Dash

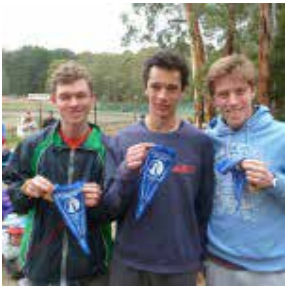
McKinnon Secondary College won all three trophies in the Schools' category of the recent Schools/Scouts/Cadets Rogaine Championship at Daylesford – the Neil Phillips Trophy (Boys), the Christine Hall Trophy (Girls) and the Sheahan Trophy (Mixed).

Their team of Year 11 and 12 boys – Peter Whalan, Nick Parkinson and Nathan Douglas won the event overall with a score of 1090 points in just over 4½ hours, narrowly beating last year's winners from Trinity who came in 16 minutes earlier with 1040 points. I guess that Patrick, Jono and Jeremy from Trinity (2nd overall and 1st Boys Yr.10 & under) planned too short a course and found themselves back near the HH with lots of time and nowhere to go; a problem that most of us have experienced at some event or another.

Three girls from McKinnon SC, Mary Krieger, Madi Batchelor and Eleri Morgan, were the best Girls team and 4th overall with a score of 770 points. Mary has participated in the Schools' event from Years 8 to 12, previously being a member of a winning Girls Yr.10 and under team. Madi was there for her second experience and Eleri was a first timer. All three girls are cross country runners and enjoy hiking and other outdoor activities. Both of these winning teams stuck mainly to tracks and were therefore able to move quite quickly throughout the 5 hours. The girls did become 'geographically embarrassed' between CP55 and CP41 where they had to cross the formidable Sailor's Creek (or were they headed for CP22?), but learnt their lesson and stuck to tracks after that.

McKinnon SC had two more winning teams for the day: Elizabeth, Hannah, Moran and Nora won the mixed Yr.10 & under category, and Ellie and Sofia won the Girls Yr.10 & under section. What a day for McKinnon!

Scott Barnard and Rohan Lambert from Sherbrooke Forest Venturers scraped in with 15 seconds to spare! They won first place in the Venturer category and were 5th overall with a score of 770 points. The Venturers Shield goes to the group with the winning Venturer (or Rover) team, so Sherbrooke Forest took home the Shield yet again. Well done guys!

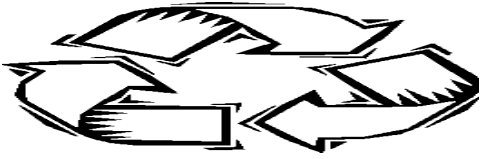
